ACTION ITEMS

Three Year Capital Plan (2025-2028)

A draft version of the Three Year Capital Plan for 2025-2028 was reviewed. The final version will be presented at the March 2024 Board Meeting.

ASCA Conference & AGM Registration

The Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) will be holding its Conference and Annual General Meeting from April 26-28, 2024. To support ASCA and division school councils, the Board agreed to pay the registration for up to four school council members wishing to attend the full conference and one registration to attend the AGM virtually.

Jurassic Electricity Storage Contract

The Board approved for the division to enter into a fifteen (15) year agreement with Jurassic Solar LP. The agreement is an innovative electricity storage solution for the division's electricity procurement.

MOA with ATA Local No.5

Local negotiations between Holy Spirit Catholic School Division and the Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA) Local No.5 has come to a conclusion. The Board ratified the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) which will be effective between September 1, 2020 to August 31, 2024.
